Area students win National Achievement scholarships

Seven area students are among approximately 800 outstanding Black American high school seniors nationwide who have won Achievement Scholarship awards through the National Achievement Scholarship Program.

These awards, totaling over \$2 million, are financed by grants from 34 corporate organizations and professional associations, and by National Merit Scholarship Corporation.

The National Achievement Scholarship Program is a privately financed academic competition established in 1964 specifically to honor scholastically talented Black American youth and to provide scholarships to a substantial number of the most outstanding participants in each annual competition.
