## **Latinx Authors**



#### Elizabeth Acevedo (Young Adult)

Proudly identifying as an Afro-Latina, Acevedo is not ashamed of her Dominican and Puerto Rican background. She is also the 2022 Young People's Poet Laureate, "the New York Times-bestselling author of *The* 

**Poet** X, which won the National Book Award for Young People's Literature, and more. She is also the author of **With** the **Fire on High**—which was named a best book of the year by the New York Public Library, NPR, Publishers Weekly, and School Library Journal—and **Clap When You Land**, which was a Boston Globe—Horn Book Honor book and a Kirkus finalist."



#### Alexis Castellano (Middle Grade)

"Alexis was born and raised in Florida where she enjoyed sunny days, dramatic thunderstorms, and delicious Cuban food. After graduating from college, she moved to

New York City and worked as a scenic artist, bringing theatrical sets to life with a little bit of paint and a whole lot of ingenuity. She currently works as a graphic designer by day and spends her nights dreaming up stories. She lives in Los Angeles with her partner and her extremely photogenic cat, Belle. *Isla to Island* is her first graphic novel."







## Matt de la Peña (Children/MG/YA)



"Matt is the New York Times Bestselling, Newbery Medal-winning author of seven young adult novels and six picture books. ... *Last Stop on Market Street* (illustrated by

Christian Robinson), ... was awarded the 2016 Newbery Medal. Miguel and the Grand Harmony (illustrated by Ana Ramirez), was released by Disney in both English and Spanish. Love (illustrated by Loren Long), & Carmela Full of Wishes (illustrated by Christian Robinson), are his two newest picture books. In 2019, Matt's seventh YA novel, Superman: Dawnbreaker was published."



## Anna-Marie McLemore & Tehlor Kay Mejia (Young Adult)

"Q: How do you infuse your culture and background into your stories?

A: (TKM) It's really so instinctive; I

don't think I even realize I'm doing it. I read a lot as a kid and I loved books. I was lucky enough to sometimes see books with characters that looked like me, but they never reflected what my family felt like. At the time, I wasn't old enough to critique books, so I used to think, "Oh, I guess books aren't supposed to feel like home for people like me." (Mejia 2021 as quoted in Fong 2021).



#### Zoraida Córdova (YA / Middle)

"Zoraida is the acclaimed author of more than two dozen novels and short stories, including, *Star Wars: The High Republic: Convergence* and *Valentina Salazar is Not a Monster Hunter*. In addition to writing novels, she serves on the board of

We Need Diverse Books, and is the co-editor of the bestselling anthology *Vampires Never Get Old*, as well as the cohost of the writing podcast, *Deadline City...* Zoraida was born in Guayaquil, Ecuador, and calls New York City home. When she's not working, she's roaming the world in search of magical stories."



#### Otávio Júnior (Children)

"Otávio Júnior is a writer, an actor, a storyteller and a theatre producer from Rio de Janeiro. He was the founder and executive coordinator of the project Ler é 10-Leia Favela, which

included the opening of libraries in the favela Complexo do Alemão. Otávio Júnior works in the children's cultural area since 1998. He now develops programs and activities to promote reading among the youngest people of the favelas in Rio de Janeiro. In 2011 he published his first book, *From My Window*. Winner of the Premio Madre Teresa de Calcutá in Argentina for his community services, he was also awarded the Prêmio Faz Diferença by the O Globo newspaper."

## Furia by Yamile Saied Méndez (YA)



## What If a Fish by Anika Fajardo (MG)




# Talking With Mother Earth / Hablando con madre tierra (Children) by Jorge Argueta Illustrated by Lucia Angela Perez
